This special bulletin provides an update on developments with Welsh at Central South Consortium (CSC) and an overview of the wide variety of professional learning (PL) and support that continue to be available at no cost to all schools in the region.

Professional learning (PL) and support for all schools in the region in the development of Welsh is now aligned to all other areas. Rather than a designated Welsh in Education Officer for each school, high quality PL and support for Welsh at CSC are within 3 areas.

'Cymraeg 2050: A million Welsh speakers' sets out our ambition of creating a million Welsh speakers by 2050. It includes targets to increase the number of teachers competent to teach Welsh as a subject and other subjects through the medium of Welsh.

It also outlines the vision for developing the Welsh language skills of all learners aged 3 to 16 as part of Curriculum for Wales to enable them to use the language in everyday contexts.

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Languages, Literacy and Communication

Welsh is a **mandatory element** of Curriculum for Wales which spans the 3 – 16 learning continuum.

The Languages, Literacy and Communication (LLC) Area of Learning and Experience (Area) addresses fundamental aspects of human communication.

It aims to support learning across the whole curriculum and to enable learners to gain knowledge and skills in Welsh, English and *international languages* as well as in *literature*.

Settings and schools need to plan to ensure all learners make appropriate progress in Welsh, in English and in international languages. The concept of a language learning continuum underlies progression in LLC. Learners will progress from having little or no language skills and knowledge towards proficiency in the languages they learn at school.



Resources to support LLC Welsh – Tric a Chlic



Tric a Chlic is a Welsh synthetic phonics programme for Welsh and English medium primary schools which aims to:

- Teach sounds and letter formation
- Teach constructive strategies to read words and to cut words up for spelling
- Encourage fluency and expression when reading from the beginning
- Offer interactive teaching methods
- Regularly reinforce actions
- Move quickly from one stage to another

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Welsh Language Professional Learning for Practitioners

Developing the Welsh language skills of our practitioners and their ability to teach Welsh and through the medium of Welsh is essential to meet the aims of Cymraeg 2050, Local Authority Welsh in Education Strategic Plans and to deliver Curriculum for Wales.

The **Professional Standards for Teaching and Leadership** and **Assisting Teaching** set out the expectation for practitioners to develop their knowledge and use of Welsh throughout their careers, as well as extending learners' skills and competence in Welsh.

To support the implementation of the professional standards, Welsh Government has developed a single **Welsh language competency framework for practitioners**.

The framework sits within the Professional Learning Passport and enables practitioners to note their progress in developing their Welsh language skills from ITE (Initial Teacher Education) throughout their careers.

The framework is also included in the **School Workforce Annual Census** (SWAC) and all Welsh language professional learning has been mapped to the framework to enable practitioners to easily identify opportunities suitable for them.


It is advised that all schools regularly ensure that all practitioners assess their Welsh language skills against the Welsh language competency framework. Schools can then analyse this data in order accurately report in the SWAC and to plan appropriate Welsh language professional learning for all practitioners.


